Re: Detention Management Reports – Required Information

**Amended information sought pursuant to s47 of the *Young Offenders Act 1994 (WA)* to assist in assessing harshness of conditions of detention, both past and future.**

**Past:**

1. Provide the specific dates between which the particular young person has been held at Banksia Hill Detention Centre (BHDC) in relation to the current charges(s) before the Court.
2. Provide the following information to specifically cover the conditions for the particular young person for the time that he or she has been held at BHDC:
  - (1) a running daily account setting out details of the actual hours that an education program(s), if any, has actually been provided, and if so, details of the kind and content of the program(s), and of the young person's performance.
  - (2) a running daily account setting out details of the actual hours, and the kind(s) and content of other rehabilitation programs (not including recreation programs), if any, that have actually been provided, and
  - (3) a running daily account setting out details of the actual hours and the kind(s) and content of recreation programs, if any, that have actually been provided outside of a unit block, and
  - (4) a running daily account setting out the actual hours of lockdowns, both in a cell and also outside a cell but inside a unit.

For the purpose of this paragraph, a lockdown in a cell means and includes time that a young person is in a cell:

- (a) when the cell door is locked, and also
- (b) when the cell door is closed but not locked or when the cell door is open to any extent, and the young person is not allowed out of the cell, and

(5) a running daily account setting out details of the dates and the number of hours on each day that the young person has been held in an observation cell or any other kind of cell in the HARDING wing of BHDC, and the reason(s) for it,

(6)

(1) has the young person's diet, meaning food and/or drinks, been different in any way to what, at the same time(s), has been given to other young persons held in different cell blocks or not on any kind or the same kind of behavioural or support program as the young person? and if so,

(2) give full details of:

- (a) the difference/differences of the food and/or drinks, and
- (b) the relevant time period(s) for the difference/differences, and,
- (c) the reason(s) why there has been the difference/differences.

3. If there is likely to be any material change in the future for the young person in relation to,

- (1) the number and kind of programs delivered, and
- (2) the extent of lockdowns, and
- (3) diet,

when compared to the answers in questions 2(1) to 2(6) inclusive, then provide details of all of the material changes and the timeframes for each of them, respectively.
